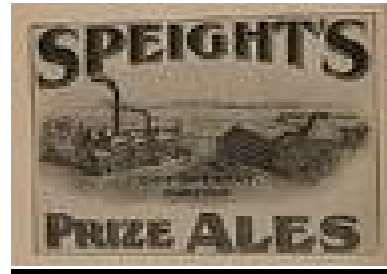

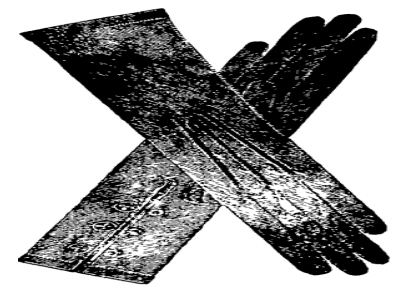

Wool

This season is going rather well for wool as the prices have come up 2d since last weeks 5d per pound of quality fleece. The exports have been given a boost by the introduction of the merino breed of sheep. Their fine quality of wool and ease of care make them a very popular breed in the high country areas of Otago. Charles Robinson quotes: 'so far the overall opinion of the merino is that they are a jolly good resource for wool and the flighty nature of the breed is the only drawback'.

Meat

It has been 25 years in November since the first successful attempt to send a refrigerated cargo of lamb from Port Chalmers and the whole of New Zealand will be celebrating.

400 beef carcasses and 900 muttons were taken into the Alliance butchery this week and were paid for regally with £12 per live weight in mutton and £19 per deadweight for beef. The continuous amount of mutton is extraordinary for this late in the season.

Perishable goods

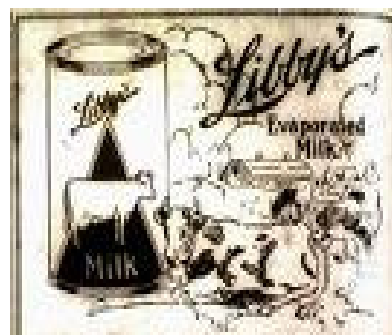
